■ Ju-Young Baek (Violin)

Winner of the numerous prizes at international competitions including Sibelius in 1995, Paganini in 1997, the first prize at Toa International in 1997, Indianapolis in 1998 and the first prize at Young Concert Artist International Auditions in New York City. She is also a professor at Music Department, University of Seoul.

■ Heiichiro Ohyama (Viola / Headmaster)

Music Director and Conductor of the Santa Barbara Chamber Orchestra (USA), Artistic Director of CHANEL Pygmalion Days Chamber Music Series. Former Assistant Conductor and Principal Violist of the Los Angeles Philharmonic. He was a professor of Music at University of California from 1973 until 2002.

■ Alessio Bax (Piano)

Winner of the Hamamatsu International Piano Competition in 1997 and the Leeds International Pianoforte Competition in 2000. He also received the Avery Fisher Career Grant in 2009. Currently he is a faculty member of the Meadows School of the Arts, Southern Methodist University.

■ Alexander Buzlov (Cello)

He won the Silver Medal at the 13th International Tchaikovsky Competition in 2007 and 2nd prize at the 68th International Cello Competition in Geneva. He is also a faculty member at Moscow Music Institute.

[Requirements]

- Age 39 and younger. Person who aims to be a professional musician or already made a carrier as a professional musician who needs further experience in chamber music.
- Not only individual but a group application is accepted. (However, the instruments
 are strictly designated as stated. And each member of the group needs to submit
 application materials respectively.)

[Participation fee]

80,000 yen per person (including tax and 1 ticket for the Academy Faculty Performance on January 13)

- Participants will be responsible for transportation costs to the venue and other expenses including lodging and food during the Academy.
- No cancellation accepted after the payment is made.

[Selection & Notification]

After faculty reviews application materials, the notification letter will be sent out by the end of November.

[Remarks]

- Participants are allowed to sit in on all lessons during the period, and rehearsals for the final concert.
- Application materials will not be returned. We will destroy them after the Academy is over.
